

**ORDINANCE NO. 2012 - 76**

**AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH RAWDON MYERS INC. FOR THE PURCHASE OF COMPONENTS TO UP GRADE THE WATER RECLAMATION PLANT AND THE COLLECTION SYSTEM'S SUPERVISORY CONTROL AND DATA ACQUISITION (SCADA) EQUIPMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$106,756.00, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, The City of Mason has used MultiTrode control components in the collection system for the past 12 years, and has found the equipment to be very reliable; and

WHEREAS, Rawdon Myers Inc. presented a bid of \$106,756.00 for the purchase of components to upgrade the supervisory control and data acquisition (SCADA) system for the collection systems which include additional capacity in the software to begin upgrading the SCADA at the WRP.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Mason, Ohio, six members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That the City of Mason accepts the price of \$106,756.00 from Rawdon Myers Inc.

Section 2. That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute contract documents with Rawdon Myers Inc. for the purchase of components to upgrade the SCADA system for the collections system and the WRP on behalf of the City of Mason.

Section 3. That the Finance Director is hereby authorized to make pay Rawdon Myers Inc. on the basis of the approved payment application up to and not to exceed the contract amount of the total sum of \$106,756.00 for said equipment and technical support.

Section 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of public health, safety, and general welfare and shall be effective immediately upon its passage. The reason for said declaration is the need to keep the City's seven lift stations operating properly. The reliability for the conveyance of raw sewage to the WRP is essential to maintain public health and safety.
