

ORDINANCE NO. 2001-152

**DECLARING CERTAIN EQUIPMENT AS SURPLUS PROPERTY AND
AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO INDEFINITELY LOAN THE
EQUIPMENT**

WHEREAS, Council has determined that there is certain equipment which is outmoded and no longer needed for public use as set out in Ohio Revised Code Section 721.15, which equipment is more particularly described as a DataMaster blood alcohol analyzer used by the Mason Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the continued storage and maintenance of such equipment imposes a cost to the City without any benefit to the City; and

WHEREAS, after efforts to sell such equipment, it has been determined that there is no market value for such equipment, which was intended to be used only by police departments in the prosecution of DUI offenses; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Carlisle has indicated the DataMaster would enhance its ability to prosecute DUIs; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mason has determined that it would serve the public interest to donate the DataMaster to Carlisle, as Carlisle operates a small police force with limited resources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Mason, Ohio, seven members elected thereto concurring:


Section 1. That the DataMaster blood alcohol analyzer previously used by the City of Mason Police Department is hereby declared to be surplus property no longer needed for municipal purposes or unfit for public use.


Section 2. That the City Manager is hereby authorized to indefinitely loan said DataMaster, "as is", to the Municipality of Carlisle for use by its police force, with no warranties, explicit or implicit.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
