

RESOLUTION 2001-27

PROCLAIMING OCTOBER 7-13, 2001 AS NATIONAL FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

WHEREAS, cooking, heating, and electrical fires represent three of the nation's leading causes of home fires, and are collectively responsible for nearly half of all home fires and almost one-third of the associated fire deaths; and

WHEREAS, the vast majority of home cooking, heating, and electrical fires can be prevented by taking simple safety precautions; and

WHEREAS, developing a home fire escape plan and practicing it at least twice a year are critical to escaping a fire safely; and

WHEREAS, proper installation, testing, and maintenance of smoke alarms are all part of a thorough home fire escape plan; and

WHEREAS, by recognizing and addressing the leading cause of home fires, and by developing and practicing a thorough home fire escape plan, residents can greatly reduce their risk of experiencing a home fire; and

WHEREAS, the health, safety and well-being of this community greatly depends on the City's fire protection facilities and services; and

WHEREAS, the employees of the City of Mason Fire Department are dedicated to the safety of life and property from the devastating effects of fire.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Mason, Ohio, six members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That the Council of the City of Mason, Ohio hereby designates and proclaims October 7-13, 2001 as "National Fire Prevention Week" in the City of Mason.

Section 2. That all citizens and civic organizations of the City of Mason are encouraged to recognize the contributions which the City of Mason Fire Department makes every day to the health, safety and well-being of the community.

Section 3. That this Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law;
