

**ORDINANCE NO. 2013 - 78**

**AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH BRUNK EXCAVATING, INC., IN THE AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$38,147.00, FOR THE DEMOLITION OF 5 RESIDENCES AND THEIR ACCESSORY STRUCTURES AS PART OF THE MOVING OHIO FORWARD GRANT PROGRAM AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, bids were received for the Demolition of five existing residences and their accessory structures as part of the Moving Ohio Forward Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, Brunk Excavating, Inc. was the lowest and best bidder with a total bid of \$38,147.00 for the Demolition of five existing residences and their accessory structures as part of the Moving Ohio Forward Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the Moving Ohio Forward Grant Program is a program with funding allocated by the State of Ohio Attorney General for the demolition of residential properties, and the City of Mason is an authorized sub-recipient of funding through Warren County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Mason, Ohio, seven members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That the total bid of Brunk Excavating, Inc., in the amount of \$38,147.00 is hereby accepted as the lowest and best bid for the Demolition of five existing residences and their accessory structures as part of the Moving Ohio Forward Grant Program.

Section 2. That the City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with Brunk Excavating, Inc. for the Demolition of five existing residences and their accessory structures as part of the Moving Ohio Forward Grant Program according to the specifications set forth by the City.

Section 3. That the Finance Director is hereby authorized to pay Brunk Excavating, Inc. an amount not to exceed \$38,147.00 for the Demolition of five existing residences and their accessory structures as part of the Moving Ohio Forward Grant Program.

Section 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare and shall be effective immediately upon its passage. The reason for said declaration of emergency is the need to complete the demolition and then for the City to subsequently file the required documents for reimbursement prior to the end of the calendar year.
