I responded to Lou's Pony Keg for a traffic crash. Warren County Dispatch advised that a vehicle drove into a building. On arrival, I observed Ohio DYU3106 parked directly in front of the front door. The car, as well as the building, had substantial damage. Sitting on a nearby bench was a male subject, who was identified as William Caruso. Parked in a parking stall to the passenger side of DYU3106 was another vehicle. The owner of the vehicle was identified as Chris Roell. Chris pointed to Caruso and indicated that Caruso was driving the wrecked vehicle. Roell added that he was inside the store when he observed the vehicle drive into the store. He mentioned that it appeared that Mr. Caruso never slowed down before running into the building. Mr. Roell was not injured.

I introduced myself to William Caruso and asked him if he was operating Ohio DYU3106. He stated he was. He offered that as he pulled into the parking stall, his foot slipped off the brake. He explained that he was unable to apply the brake before striking the building. As we spoke, I detected an odor of alcohol from his person. I also noticed that his eyes were bloodshot and glassy. As he spoke, he was slow to respond to my questions and at times I had to repeat myself. I asked William (Bill) how much alcohol he consumed. He said he had "4 or 5 Beam and Cokes." He added that he had them after noon and they were an average glass size drink which he had on the rocks. I asked him if he had his seat belt on and he said he did. He held a cane and explained that he has a disease that affects nerves in his feet. He said he currently takes medications for it and added that alcohol doesn't affect the medications.

Mason EMS and Fire arrived prior to me. I spoke with a paramedic and asked if they had evaluated Bill. He stated that Bill was evaluated prior to my arrival and was ok. He refused transport.

Based on the traffic crash, odor of alcohol, bloodshot and glassy eyes and admittance of alcohol consumption I informed Caruso that I was going to field test him. The first and only test I performed on him was the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus. I explained the test and asked if he understood his instructions. He stated he did. He had a pair of glasses on. I checked his eyes and noticed that they tracked equally and his pupils were both of equal size. I observed six out of six clues for nystagmus.

I informed Caruso that he was under arrest for OVI. I escorted him to my patrol vehicle and searched him. Due to his dependency on his cane, I explained to him that he was under arrest, however, I was not going to place him in handcuffs. He was placed in the rear seat of cruiser #12 and transported to the Mason Police Department.

Sgt. Cullen assisted as we arrived to the police department. I read Bill the BMV2255 and we discussed the penalties as a result of a refusal or test. He agreed to take the test and offered both breath samples to the Intoxilizer 8000. The machine read his bac at .138. His license was seized and he was provided a copy of his paperwork. I explained the court date and time to him.

Upon completion of the OVI process Mr. Carusso began rubbing his upper left chest and complaining about discomfort. I asked him if he was ok and he said he was fine. It was obvious to Sgt. Cullen and I that he was having continuing pain. He explained that he has a pacemaker and it felt like it was causing pain. Sgt. Cullen requested the Warren County Communication Center contact EMS and have them respond.

Mason EMS arrived and evaluated Bill. It was their recommendation that he get checked out at the hospital. He declined transportation and requested to go home. Sgt. Cullen and I also spoke with Bill and tried to encourage him to get checked out as well. He stated he did not want to get treatment.

I transported Bill home to his address in West Chester. At his residence I spoke with his wife. I explained his paperwork and court appearance date and time. I also explained that he was suffering form discomfort in his upper left chest and had refused to get treatment from Mason EMS. She stated she will take care of him.
